Stand Up Forklift Attachments - The internal combustion engine powered forklifts are accordingly labeled to the fuel kind utilized. Type "G" forklifts are fueled by gasoline. These meet fire hazard least requirements and is the most common designation for lift trucks powered by gas. Forklifts labeled "G" are not used in unsafe sites for apparent reasons. Type "GS" forklifts are gasoline fueled and meet all requirements of a Type "G" lift truck and have other equipment installed to the exhaust and electrical and fuel system to allow them to be utilized in some unsafe places. Type "GS" forklifts are utilized in similar applications to Type "EE" electric trucks.

Type "LP" trucks are fueled by LPG and do satisfy the minimum standard for fire hazards. This is the most widespread designation used on gasoline fueled lift trucks. The lift trucks labeled "LP" are not used in unsafe sites. Type "LPS" trucks are fueled by LPG and meet all the requirements of a Type "G" truck. They have various pieces of equipment set up to the electrical system, fuel system, and exhaust system to be able to allow them to be utilized in certain unsafe applications. Type "LPS" forklifts are utilized in similar applications to Type "GS" and Type "EE" electric trucks.

Type "G/LP" trucks are dual fuel models for the reason that they can be operated on either gasoline or LPG with no change to the fuel system. Forklifts labeled "G/LP" meet the minimum standards for fire hazards. Forklifts labeled "G/LP" are not utilized in dangerous sites. Type "GS/LPS" lift trucks are dual fuel models since they can be operated on gasoline or LPG without any change to the fuel system. These trucks satisfy all the requirements of a Type "GS" or Type "LPS" truck and have other machines installed to their fuel system, exhaust system and electrical system, in order to allow them to be used in some dangerous applications. Type "GS/LPS" forklifts are utilized in similar applications to Type "GS", Type "LPS" and Type "EE" electric lift trucks.

Lift trucks fueled by diesel that meet minimum requirements for fire hazards are labeled type "D". These forklifts are not to be used in hazardous places. Type "DS" forklifts are fueled by diesel and meet all requirements of a Type "D" truck and comprise other equipment installed to the exhaust system, electrical system and fuel system so as to allow them to be utilized in certain unsafe places. Type "DS" forklifts are utilized in related applications to Type "GS", Type "LPS" and Type "EE" electric trucks. Type "DY" trucks are fueled by diesel and meet all the requirements of Type "DS" lift trucks and in addition do not have any electrical equipment installed. These make use of air starters and have provisions for limiting the temperature of truck parts. These type forklifts are utilized in similar application to the Type "EE" electric trucks.
